On Saturday, May 10, nearly 40 people, youth and adults, from 14 foundations and 6 support organizations came together at The Boston Foundation for a Gathering on Youth Philanthropy. This was our very first regional Gathering and was supported in partnership with the National Center for Family Philanthropy, The Boston Foundation, and the sponsorship of Foundant Technologies. YPC Leadership Team members Jamie Semel, Lizzie Jack, and Sam Murphy-Cripps did a tremendous job facilitating the Gathering which featured the youth philanthropy efforts of a local Boston family, the Highland Street Foundation who supports school-based youth philanthropy programs, the Greater Worcester Community Foundation and the Community Foundation for MetroWest which both support community-based youth philanthropy programs, the Rivers Schools with a school-based youth philanthropy program, and the work of Brandeis University's collegiate youth philanthropy programs, including the national contest, [Generous U](#). Interestingly, most of the adults were drawn to a conversation about impact and evaluation of youth philanthropy programs. Thank you to all who attended and were involved!

Foundation Center Partnership Update

As you may recall, one of the strategic partnerships of Youth Philanthropy Connect this year is with the [Foundation Center](#) to support a planning process to look at the opportunities for aggregating data and information to support the youth philanthropy field. An important step in the planning process was a retreat of youth philanthropy players held at the end of May in New York City. The retreat used design thinking and graphic facilitation to utilize the experiences and ideas of the great group of attendees (pictured) to compile trends and cool things they are seeing in the field as well as think about what is needed. Themes of needs included: overall youth philanthropy aggregation of info/data; evaluation and impact, outcomes and measures of youth philanthropy;

more media and buzz around youth philanthropy; and youth leadership with adult partners in philanthropy. Our friends from the Foundation Center, Jen Bokoff and Amanda Dillon, will be attending the YPC Conference to share their findings so far and get input from youth and adult attendees. A final report with recommendations is expected this Fall.

ADULT SESSION: Money Messages- Weaving together your Relationship with Money for Philanthropic Good

In this interactive discussion session, participants will explore and discuss personal money messages. The session will raise awareness about these messages - the way we view identity, purpose, and beliefs about money - and how these views impact our philanthropic decisions and how we pass these along to our youth. Participants will identify their assumptions about money and wealth, investigate how assumptions about money drive behavior, clarify what they want their own money messages to be and begin to build a healthy, conscious relationship to money.
