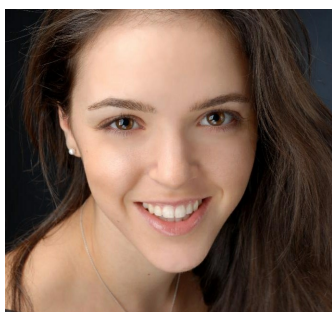


Announcing Dave DeLuca and Erin Schrode as Keynote Speakers for YPC's 2014 Conference
