Meet Two Youth Philanthropists: Leadership Team Members Dhruv Patel and Raquel Barajas



"Why not take the opportunity?"

That is what **Dhruv Patel** asked by a family member to get engaged with the [Youth Philanthropy Connect's \(YPC\) Leadership Team](#). An 8th grader at Fairmont Private School, Patel has been a member of the [Tarsadia Foundation](#)'s Youth Board since 2009.

The Tarsadia Foundation was established in 1999 by founders, BU and Pushpa Patel to honor the family's legacy of selfless giving and service. Its mission is to fund nonprofit organizations in the fields of health, education, and economic empowerment. Its Youth Board reviews two grant cycles a year—a summer cycle and a winter cycle. **"We get together and decide which organization we'd like to fund," Patel explained.** "And we obviously ... Raquel Barajas posed the question: "You know how people become afraid of things that aren't similar to them so that causes a lot of anger and aggression?" The youth philanthropist from San Francisco plans on changing this cultural flaw plaguing public schools, which leads to widespread bullying and discrimination. She has already started the great fight as a supervisor for [Youth Funding Youth Ideas \(YFYI\)](#) and a member of [Youth Philanthropy Connect's Leadership Team](#).



Barajas is a sophomore at San Francisco State University, studying health education, with a focus on community-based health, and Latino studies. Her philanthropic journey started when she was only 15 years old and working for YFYI's sister program, Youth Line—a phone line dedicated just for youth. After being offered the opportunity to join YFYI from there, **she became a program officer and took on the tasks of attending site visits, managing budgets, supporting the other youth involved, and creating and facilitating curriculum.**

As a high-risk youth herself, Barajas was struggling in school and "falling into the wrong crowd" before she found YFYI. "Being a part of an organization like this really is what made me ... ([**\(Read Raquel's full profile here.\)**](#)


New Research Reveals the Positive Trend in Giving Rates Through Generations of Families

The [Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy](#) and [Vanguard Charitable](#) partnered on this research exploring how giving is cultivated within families. **This unique data will allow philanthropists and nonprofit organizations to better connect with donors of all ages to pass along the value of giving.**

Some key findings:

- Among high net-worth families included in the study, all three generations gave to charity in 78 percent of them
- Parents and their adult children give in similar proportions to the arts, environmental groups, international organizations and religious causes
- Generation X (born between 1965-1980) are more likely to volunteer than Millennials (born after 1981)
