"Do you want to be a part of HANDS?"

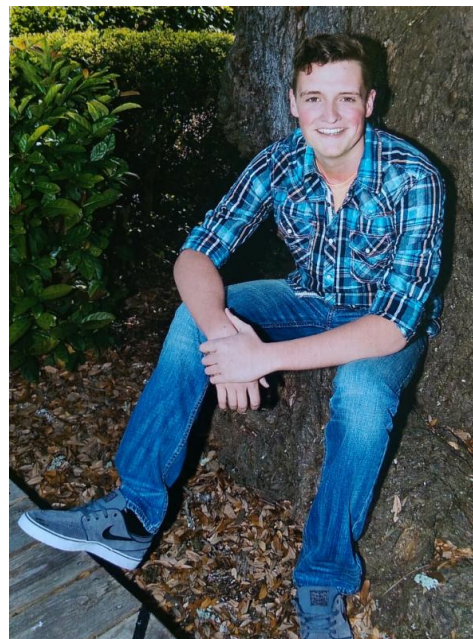
"What's that?"
